In addition to his work on behalf of hungry children, Sam has overseen the Senior Outreach program in recent years as well. This effort has grown to serve more than 1,000 seniors through 20 program sites, and he is working to expand the program's reach by utilizing several new distribution models. Sam was born and raised in Knoxville, attended West High School and the University of Tennessee.
