Cooks (any age)

By 10:45 AM, make and bring chili to the Fellowship Hall to enter "The Great Chili Cookoff—2024." Bring your slow cooker, and we will plug it in. You can take it home afterward.

By 10:45 AM, make and bring baked goods for the title of "Best Dessert—2024." After we are done, you can take your plate or pan home.

Bring Food Items

If you want to help with food but don't want to cook, you can bring items to top the chili, such as corn chips, cheese, sour cream, chives, etc. Please let us know what you are bringing.

Additionally, we will need some power strips for the crockpots. Text Jessica if you know of any we can borrow.

<u>Kitchen Help-</u> 3 to 4 volunteers (adults and a couple of teens to move tables)

This job is at 10:45 AM DURING late service. It entails managing the church kitchen and drinks, arranging any sides, and setting up disposable plates, cups, bowls, eating utensils, and napkins for the chili and baked goods bar. Clean-up should be done by 1:30 PM.

Outdoor Greeters- 2 to 3 volunteers (adults)

At noon, this job is to greet people as they pull into the parking lot, direct them to the Fellowship Hall, and explain everything that is happening. We need someone friendly and welcoming. This job is from noon until approximately 1 PM unless people are still arriving.

Indoor Greeters- 3 to 4 volunteers (adults)

At noon, this job is to stand at the door to the Fellowship Hall and distribute two tickets of different colors to each person who arrives. The tickets are a ballet for the baked goods and chili cookoff. Explain to the people how to vote and be friendly. The time frame is from noon to an estimated 1 PM.

<u>Craft/Game Leaders</u>- 40 volunteers divided into 20 teams (this can be teens and adults)

This job begins at 10:30 AM DURING late service to arrive and set up. Your activity will be given to you in a box, and you can look it over and familiarize yourself with any instructions before the kids arrive at noon. The time frame is from 10:30 AM to an estimated 1:45-2 PM.
